Discussion about

1. Fixed Deposit (FD)

- We learned that Fixed Deposits are one of the safest ways to save money with guaranteed returns. As students, this could be a great way to park our savings or scholarship money.
- It was highlighted that while returns are fixed, they may not always beat inflation, which means the value of money might reduce over time.

2. Inflation Rate

- The resource person explained inflation as the rise in prices over time, which reduces our purchasing power.
- We understood that it's important to invest in ways that give us returns higher than the inflation rate, otherwise our savings lose value.

3. Sovereign Gold Bond (SGB)

- We were introduced to Sovereign Gold Bonds as a safe and digital way to invest in gold, without the hassle of storing physical gold.
- SGBs offer both capital appreciation (linked to gold prices) and annual interest, which makes them a good long-term option.

4. Peer-to-Peer (P2P) Lending

- P2P lending was explained as a platform where individuals can lend and borrow money directly through online platforms.
- While it's an innovative financial tool, we learned that it involves credit risk, and as beginners, we need to understand it thoroughly before investing.

5. Stock Market

- The stock market was described as a place where company shares are bought and sold. It reflects the economic health of the country.
- We realized that understanding how the market works can help us start our investment journey early and grow our wealth.

6. Trading vs Investment

- The difference between trading and investing was clearly explained. Trading is short-term and needs quick decisions, while investing is long-term and based on research.
- As students, we were advised to focus more on investment for long-term wealth rather than risky trading unless we gain more experience.

7. StockEdge

- We were introduced to StockEdge, a financial research app that helps analyze stocks, track portfolios, and learn about the market.
- It was a practical tool recommended by the speaker to help us get started with stock market research and build financial knowledge.

8. Mutual Funds

- Mutual funds were presented as a simple and effective way to invest in a group of stocks or bonds managed by professionals.
- We learned that mutual funds are beginner-friendly and suitable for students who want to invest small amounts regularly.

9. Lumpsum and SIP

- The concept of **Lumpsum** (investing a large amount at once) and **SIP** (investing smaller amounts regularly) was explained.
- For students, SIP was recommended as it promotes consistent saving habits and makes investing affordable and systematic.

10. Insurance

- The session also covered the importance of insurance, especially life and health insurance.
- Although we may not need it immediately, we now understand how insurance provides financial security against unexpected events in life.

11. Technical Analysis

- We were introduced to the basics of technical analysis using charts and indicators to predict stock price movements.
- It was interesting to learn how traders use this to make decisions, but we were advised to study it well before applying it.
